Chengeta/ Pamuzinda

Imire Game Park

A safari lodge located 115km from Harare City Centre, with a variety of game including elephants, lions, wildebeest just to mention but a few. At the end of Haslemere Lane, 1km off the Umwinsdale Rd, is this place; it is signposted. It's set atop a spectacular hill, overlooking a picture-perfect valley complete with giraffes and buffalo - a visit is a must. The studio and gallery sells designer silverware from jewellery to tableware and whimsical paperweights (collector items or presents for the person who has everything). Mavros' signature style in his jewellery is the ndoro shell, the original currency of Zimbabwe. He also has a shop in Knightsbridge, London, though this one is cheaper!

Lion Park

The Lion Park is a must see stop if visiting Harare. It's a short drive from the city centre and gives you the opportunity to see some great wildlife up close and not all behind fences and cages.

There are 3 segments of the park namely:

a.) A Lion enclosure which you can drive through, it's not so big so you are almost guaranteed to be just meters from the lions.

b.) The main zoo style are, which has lots of animal enclosures including lions, hyenas, baboons, crocodiles, turtles, emus, wild pigs and more.

c.) A large game drive in the open, where you can see wildebeest, springboks lots of birds and more. Driving through the bigger park gives you the chance to see more animals in their more natural habitat, lots of interesting rock formations, flora and fauna.

Mukuvisi Woodlands

It lies in a distance of about 10 minutes from Harare city centre. It is a paradise for the nature lovers and the bird watchers, and the park is one of the must visit tourist attraction in Harare. Some of the species which you can view are Miombo Blue Eyed Starling, Greater Blue Eared Starling, Miombo Rock thrush, Spotted Creeper, Thick Billed Weaver, Golden Weaver, Southern Red Bishop and some species of red warbles. The visitors can go for trailing in the woods too. Among the animals you will be able to see the bush pig, bushbuck, black backed jackals, crocodiles, Duiker, Eland, Giraffe, Impala, Ostrich, Tortoise, and Zebra Terrapin. Among the flora, you can see a wide variety of orchids.

Masvingo Day Trip

Includes guided tour, lunch, entry fees and return transfers to Harare)

About 06:30 depart Harare for the famous Great Zimbabwe is the site of an ancient city in Masvingo. These fascinating structures are the remains of a powerful state both politically and economically. They are formed out of granite stones placed on top of each other with no cement. Attractions are the Conical Tower, the Great Enclosure, the Hill complex and the Museum. Professionally trained guides will also take you through the history of the conical tower and the hill complex which used to be the king's dwelling.

This drive will take approximately 3 hours. Along the way, you can stop at a restaurant for breakfast (own account). Thereafter, late lunch will be served at the Great Zimbabwe Hotel.

Departure back to Harare will be soon after lunch!

Heroes Acre Tour

Museum

Close to the entrance of the Heroes Acre is a small museum that contains a brief history of the liberation struggle, along with artefacts, photos, documents and other paraphernalia from the war and the period shortly after independence.

The Statue of the Unknown Soldier

The Statue of the Unknown Soldier commemorates the many Zimbabweans who died in the rebellion against the Rhodesian government. The statue is bronze sculptured and consists of three figures, one woman and two men, a flagpole with the Zimbabwe National Flag and tomb for the Unknown Soldier.

The Eternal Flame

The Eternal Flame sits on a 40 metre high tower. It was lit at Independence celebrations and depicts the spirit of Independence. The tower is the highest point of the site and can be seen from many parts of Harare. This tower, built at the top of the southern hill is accessible through a flight of stairs extending from the foot of the hill.

Wall Murals

Two walls on either side of the monuments are adorned with murals that tell the story of Zimbabwe from before the 1st Chimurenga through the 2nd Chimurenga to independence.

Seven artists from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and ten from Zimbabwe created the design and artwork used in the murals and other parts of the site

Domboshava Cave and Rock Paintings

The cave contains evidence of an era by-gone, that which today still serves as a place where the Shona people of the surrounding area meet with their Provider - The Rain-Maker- through traditional ceremony. You will find creativity of the people who had drawn pictures of their world – full of animals and themselves – onto rocks– have long since gone. These paintings have weathered all storms. The paintings comprise of stone-age art of rhinos, elephants, giraffes, hippos and people.

Domboshava lies 27km north of Harare, a short drive out from the busy city into the more dusty rural landscapes that lead to the “RED ROCK” – a direct Shona translation of the name Domboshava. This is a large granite "kopje" or "whaleback", rising out of the central plateau Highveld. Most of the surrounding areas are densely populated and cultivated but Domboshava is relatively well protected by National Monuments of Zimbabwe and is of great botanical interest.
